Members swimming ability ranges from improver to International Masters competitors. There is also a wide range in age from early twenties to mideighties. Members compete in both pool & open water based events both in Ireland and abroad. The club organise the Irish Open Long Course Masters Championships in March of each year, and also organises the Thomond Swim an 1800m open water event which takes place on the River Shannon in Limerick city during the summer months.
